Editor's note:

One league has re-affiliated after a couple of years' absence and Cottesmore School and W&WS have responded by affiliating to the County Association and I reiterate my welcome to them. There are some rules I just don't think the NSRA can enforce!

(Speaking of the NSRA, Hon Sec trusts you've all completed your club affiliation paperwork to ensure you are covered on the insurance front and encouraged all your members to join as Associate or Shooting Members, if they are not already Life or Annual Members.)

So, Happy New Year to one and all and Good Shooting for 2004, albeit I have no doubt we'll be well in to 2004 before this ever goes out!

To those who wondered what the bicycle was doing on the front cover of the last Sighter, ie those who didn't read the contents, it related to

the Sussex Historic Churches Trust sponsored bike ride which our illustrious County President persuaded Hon Sec to take part in. A few comments on this later perhaps but, initially, my thanks to all those who sponsored me and my particular thanks to Sue Thomas, our Captain of Ladies Vice, without whom I could not have completed the day - she knowing the Seaford and Newhaven areas like the back of her hand, plus also seeming to know all the residents. We were just a tad on the sore side at the finish but had to admit it was a thoroughly enjoyable day.

As those who attended know, the County Dinner and Prizegiving on 25 October raised a little something to chew on for future consideration, ie the lamb in the casserole. It was very much a case of pot luck as to whether the lamb put on individual plates was good or not so good and I did mention this to both the caterer and the South of England Centre after the event. However, everything else seemed to go well and my thanks to those who attended to collect their trophies and medals. To those who feel Hon Sec should really 'kick up a stink' about the lamb, I would ask you to bear in mind that we have had several very successful meals provided by the caterers and the choice of menu was a committee decision. I can do nothing but praise the caterers for their efforts on our behalf in recent years and their friendliness and assistance both during the afternoons when the trophies get set up and the evenings whilst the event goes on. Hon Sec for one would have no hesitation in returning to the venue.

As it happens, the County Committee had already decided to try another venue in a different part of the county for 2004 and the Dinner and Prizegiving this year will be at Mannings Heath Golf Club on Saturday 23 October. The menu will be decided upon shortly and Hon Sec hopes to see representatives from all clubs in attendance. She has already ascertained that the Rye/

Hastings/Eastbourne brigade will be happy to travel, so it will be nice for them to meet up with more from the very west of the county, plus, of course, all those from the Horsham/Warnham/Handcross areas, ie the locals. Time will tell on this but the venue does look very good.

COUNTY RESULTS

The finals of the 2003 Plumpton Trophy (10m air pistol) and the Sir Duncan Watson Pistol Championship (20 yard air pistol) were held on 28 September at the Edenbridge range, courtesy of Trevor Budgen, one of our individual members (ie resident in Sussex but belonging to a club just over the border).

Both finals were split into two squads to enable those who qualified for both events to complete in each final and full results are published on one of the later pages.

Entries to the two championships have fallen over recent years and John and Liz Twyford would like to see more shooters taking part in their own county championships. Entry forms have the closing date of 1 November and go out at the AGM. The date can be a little flexible and late entries are acceptable. In theory, two stages plus a final but latterly just one early stage to qualify for the final. Why not make John and Liz happy bunnies and get all your club's pistol shooters to enter this year, before some of us rifle shooters start taking pistol a bit more seriously?

Keeping with air pistol shooting, and joining it with air rifle, the County Open Airgun Meeting held in the sports hall at Plumpton College over the first weekend in October was another successful meeting, again attracting entries from all over the country - just a shame so many of our own Sussex air rifle and air pistol shooters didn't make the effort to go along and take a look. One shooter arrived home from Saudi Arabia on the Sunday morning, said hello to his wife, picked up his air rifle and proceeded straight to Plumpton. Now that's what you call being keen to shoot!

Not only a first class meeting, but also first class catering (courtesy of Hazel Green and her

erstwhile washer-up, Sue Thomas). There were tombola prizes by the dozen and this, with the catering, helped on the financial side of running the meeting.

Full results are published later. If you shoot air rifle or air pistol, no matter to what standard, do come along in 2004, if only for the catering!!

Bossom Cup - As always Geoff Thomas, our County Vice Captain, gathered together a team of shooters to take part in this annual event against Reserve Teams from Sussex, Surrey and Kent, hosted and run by Tunbridge Wells & St Peter's Club at the South East Rifle Meeting on Saturday 20 September.

Geoff always has a struggle to get a team together who qualify for the event (ie those who qualify as reserves and not main county team members) and he had to bring in one extra person at the very last minute this year. Nonetheless, the team this time all but gave Surrey a run for their money, effectively just one point per person per card lower. The teams finished with Surrey on 7548, Sussex on 7505 and Kent on 7391. The individual scores were:

Hon Sec would like to be able to report that at the Bisley Rifle Meeting in August, Sussex won all the County events but, unfortunately, this was not to be. There were only 12 Sussex residents competing in the week's aggregate, with 24 in the weekend agg. (it seems more of us prefer to travel up to The Scottish Rifle Meeting, where Sussex residents make up a large part of the total entry.)

In the Inter County matches during the week, it can only be said that we did our best, did our bit, caused no trouble, behaved very well (mostly), hit mainly our own targets and had an enjoyable time in the process.

In the Queen Alexandra Cup Competition, Sussex just scraped into the final in eighth place but, on the day of the final, did well to finish fourth place. The individual scores based on 20 shots deliberate, 20 shots time limit, plus a skirmisher of one minute, were:-

The good news on the day was that Eastbourne Rifle Club (Geoff, Sara and Linda) came first in

the Queen Alex Club Team of Three event to take home a gold medal each.

Hopefully, Sussex will appear again in the QA final this year.

Our County Ladies Captain has been dancing with joy recently, her teams having finished third in the 2003 annual County Women's Competition (team of ten, two indoor cards each shot after Finals Day at East Grinstead last April) and having WON the 2003 County Long Range Women's Match (team of five, single dewar shot with the County Cup at Patcham in September).

Although the scores for the indoor match were challenged (they being 18 worse than estimated), only six points were given back, leaving Sussex on 1927, behind Cornwall on 1941 and Devon on 1930.

This put the team total of 1945 well ahead of Surrey on 1933 and Devon on 1931. (YES!!!!!!!)

Not to be outdone, our County Captain Tony Wells also reports Sussex achieving its highest ever scores in both the 2003 BSA Cup and the 2003 County Cup.

In the BSA Cup (team of 20, two cards each shot at Cuckfield last April), the team score was 3894, leaving it in sixth place, Surrey winning on 3929. There were two 198's, five 197's, four 196's and only a couple of people shot below their normal expectations on the day.

Similarly, in the County Cup (team of 20, single dewar shot at Patcham in September) the team did exceedingly well to finish third on 7724, behind Surrey on 7754 and Aberdeenshire on 7751. Nick Mullins of Alpha earned his County Silver Medal by top scoring on 396, Jan Whittle on

395 being pipped at the post. Again, only one or two shooters fell below par on the day and our County Captain was delighted with the result.

GENERAL COUNTY NEWS

Having decided to re-type the list of County Medal Winners, I thought shooters in general might like to see the list of winners, which is published on a later page. As you can see, the list goes back to 1914 and many of the 'older' names will ring bells, as they tie in with some of the County or local league trophy names. The list beggers the question 'Haven't some of us been around a long time?'

As the rifle shooters amongst us are aware, entries for the various individual annual championships have generally declined over recent years and it is a sad reflection that in our Short Range Championship for the Lawson Challenge Trophy, we have now had to change the rules to reflect this downturn.

The old rule was that 'the highest 50 and equal qualifying scores pass to the second stage'. As entries now number in the low fifties and there are inevitably some NCR's, at the County Committee Meeting last January, the rule was changed so that, with effect from the 2004 Short Range Championship, the rule would be 'the top 50% up to a maximum of 50 plus equal scores pass to the

second stage'. Hon Sec appreciates she forgot to amend the top of the entry form before they were distributed and the marker will also be mentioning this with the distribution of the first round results.

As a matter of interest, the following table shows the entries for our rifle championship events over the last few years. This is published solely in the hope of encouraging more entries in the future:

On the subject of rules, it will this summer be permissible to use the Malcolm Cooper 50m range when shooting our County 50m League. Rules will go out with the stickers etc in due course.

Whilst on the subject of entries etc, may I remind everyone to ensure that they put the correct postage on the envelopes when sending cards off to markers. Why should the marker have to go to the post office to collect your cards and pay over £1 for the pleasure of doing so? Should we bring in a rule for instant disqualification if cards are sent off with insufficient postage? It is also worth your while obtaining proof of postage cards when posting targets off, otherwise you lose out when cards go astray in the post.

The new County Handbook is still in the pipeline, albeit Hon Sec and the remainder of the Committee have yet to see it. Our Chairman has been ploughing through years of minutes to bring the book up to date and it will be distributed to all clubs when the Committee has approved it.

Lightweight Sports Rifle - Anyone want to organise a County League?

Averages and results from last year's summer leagues are published for your use when filling in the entry forms relating to this year's leagues.

Remember, entries close on 15 March, so do please make sure you have not lost the forms distributed at or just after the AGM.

May I repeat the gist of what was mentioned in the last newsletter, ie that in team events, the shooters with the highest averages have to be in the higher team and it is not permissible for a shooter in a B team to have a higher starting average than his A team counterparts. In teams of five, the top five should be in the A team, with the next five in the B team etc. When Hon Sec checks the averages, corrects them, tells clubs accordingly etc, please remember this. This principle, of course, applies to both rifle and pistol regardless of how many in a team.

Aldingbourne had no trouble selecting their top five shooters for the current season; all five shooters finished the 2002/03 season with an average of 96.79.

Please also remember that when a reserve is needed, apart from advising the marker about current averages etc, that reserve cannot shoot for another team in the same league in the same round.

As half the funds raised by HS were going to All Saints at West Dean, that was the first stop (10.05). We then made our way straight into CLVC's old stomping ground of Seaford, visiting St Luke's (10.40), Sir Thomas More's (10.49), St Leonard's (11.00) and Seaford URC (11.09). By now, we had visited the church of CLVC's old Sunday School, where she examined the pulpit and established just how the vicar had managed to get himself into it, which she could never quite work out as a child! We had also visited the church where she was married and met a postman who called in to play the organ and was one of the many people we bumped into en route who was known to CLVC. HS declines to publish the name of the church but, at one of the former, we had to wait whilst a lengthy missionary story was recounted to another visitor before we could get our paperwork completed. You can either arrange your own accommodation or contact John Churchley to reserve a cottage, a chalet or lodge at Loch Leven Chalets, where he has booked the entire site for the week.

From Seaford, it was on to St Peter's at East Blatchington (11.20) past a very up-market tennis club, but we thought better of stopping for a quick game, as we were on the lookout for the elusive St John's (11.25), which turned out to be the church hall Nursery School. On to St Andrew's at Bishopstone (11.45), where CLVC met someone else she knew and took a quick ciggy break whilst HS had a nose at the manor house nearby. A quiet country place is the top end of Bishopstone; so quiet and out of the way that one resident was driving his car down the road apparently wearing nothing but his towelling robe/dressing gown!

On to Newhaven; the alternative route via bumpy path to level crossing, lifting bikes over gates, as kissing gates not designed for said bikes, up steps over bridge (where HS kept ringing her bell with a certain part of her anatomy) and down steps over another part of the railway (the Italian Job it wasn't) and down track to heaven only knows where. En route, CLVC shouts 'Egret', whilst HS shouts 'Fork 'andle'. Somewhere around the Tidemills area CLVC had spotted tall white skinny bird sitting on post sticking out of water. HS spotted fork handle sticking out nearby. It could have been a very small flamingo so far as HS was concerned. HS shown delights of the area, ie big boat with mouth open, local sewage works, Parker Pen factory, EPS factory, ESCC archive depositories etc. Nonetheless, we eventually dragged our way up to the very top of Newhaven for St Michael's (12.34) and Newhaven Baptist Church (12.40), albeit cycling the wrong way down a one-way street! CLVC took out the 'pink pig' to 'phone hubby and get him to put the kettle on whilst a quick visit was paid to St Leonard's at Denton (1.00).

After tea break, it was on to St Mary's at Tarring Neville (1.55), where HS nearly left her rucksack, and then the long hard slog up to Beddingham and St Andrew's (2.30). It has to be recorded that St Andrew's at Beddingham definitely had the best biscuits; homemade chocolate macarons - wonderful! From Beddingham, it was just a quick run back along the A27 and down to West Dean again - wasn't it? We knew where the pub was in Glynde, but someone appeared to have hidden the church. Why are they always at the top of a hill? We found St Mary's next to Glynde Place (2.55), having a good nose over the garden wall, before setting off back to the A27 and Firle (3.23). Someone needs to adjust a signpost in Firle and

not use an elastic tape measure. The sign which says 'Church 1/4 should be adjusted to 'Church around 3/4'. Nonetheless, St Peter's at Firle was duly ticked off, prior to the planned cream tea at Firle Farm via the old A27 and a quick duck under a well placed barrier.

After the second tea break (egg sarnie for one and cream tea for the other), it was off to St Mary's at Selmeston (4.45), where HS almost flew down the hill past the church and only stopped when CLVC screamed at her that the church was up on the right. Mention was made here of an old coach road which may come in useful later, so it was off to Alciston Parish Church (5.00) to find out. Having been advised of said coach road and pushed the bikes up a field, we found the coach road and were off for a mile or so along the old chalk road in the middle of nowhere, heading towards Berwick, when CLVC disappeared off the edge of the field into a ditch. The classic 'A over T' comment springs to mind but, fortunately, it was just a case of the handlebars going one way and the wheels another, the bumpy road having loosened the handlebars. It was, nonetheless, a bit disconcerting to watch. Tool kits to the ready, all was put right and off to St Michael's at Berwick we went (5.23), where CLVC managed to meet yet another person she knew!

On the last leg, we got to St Andrew's at Alfriston (5.50) where the decision was made to go straight to St Michael's at Litlington and call it a day (6.01). We trundled our way back to West Dean by about 6.30 when the cavalry came to the rescue (ie Geoff Thomas) and took us to the Golden Galleon for sustenance.

We visited 20 churches, earned 57 brownie points and collected £127 sponsorship for our efforts, half of which went to the Sussex Historic Churches Trust and half to All Saints at West Dean, Hon Sec knowing the Treasurer. We met a lot of lovely people en route and had a thoroughly enjoyable ride around lovely countryside, fortunately in good weather.

Thanks again to those shooters who sponsored me/us.
