## Editor's note:

## COUNTY RESULTS

Another successful Airgun Meeting was held over the first weekend of October, albeit one or two of those who might normally attend found themselves on a ferry heading for the Channel Isles to shoot!

Full results of the 2004 meeting are shown later but please make a note now that the Airgun Meeting in 2005 is again over the first weekend in October, namely, 1 & 2 October.

Congratulations to the winners, particularly, Jariya Sime and Sarah Bullen who respectively won the Air Rifle and Air Pistol junior events. Jariya also won the 'Senior Air Rifle Championship, with David Phillips winning the Pistol Championship and Emily Bright taking the Ladies Pistol Championship.

John and Liz Twyford advise that there were some 60 entries, one delivered by post after the event, four of who did not attend and, of the 55 who competed, only some 23 were Sussex residents.

Come on Sussex - there are loads of people who shoot air pistol and all of whom could make the

effort to give the Airgun Meeting a go. Although the course of fire is the ISSF 60 shots at 10 metres, which you may think is a lot to do in one go, you get plenty of time to shoot, it is a very friendly meeting, you can have a go at 20-second shooting and there are always plenty of refreshments and good company available.

Speaking of pistol shooting, congratulations to Trevor Budgen of Edenbridge Club and M(?) Farley of Horsham Club for winning the Plumpton College Cup 10m Championship and Duncan Watson 20y Championship. The finals took place on 17 October up at Edenbridge, just a little too late to make the presentations at the dinner.

Don't forget, these are the two major individual pistol championships within the County. The Plumpton College Cup is that held over 10 metres, whilst the Sir Duncan Watson Championship is for 20 yard pistol shooting. Why not enter this year and see whether you can make it to the second stage, or even the finals themselves.

The National Meetings for Rifle and Pistol at Bisley last August are now perhaps nothing more than a distant memory.

Hon Sec has no information to hand on the efforts of our Sussex Pistol Shooters, but, as far as the rifle shooters were concerned, only some 15 did the week's aggregate, whilst some 18 took part in the weekend agg.

Individually, Nick Mullins of Alpha finished third in A Class and will now go up to X. Emma Sigournay, who will also go up to X, shot for England Ladies and England Juniors and, with Linda Smallbone, also shot in the GB Randle Team. Along with Emma, sisters Heather and Jill, plus Peter Lewthwaite, won the Junior Cadet competition competing for the ATC, Peter also being part of the England Junior Team. Well done the Sussex Juniors - long may you reign!

Nick, having won our Sutton Final, was also the Sussex representative in the 50m Championship on the Sunday following the meeting and came fourth, having shot 593 to make his first ever Olympic Final. Well done that man!

Sussex permitted other counties to win the various inter county events during the Rifle Meeting but finished a creditable sixth in the Queen Alexandra Cup Final, the scores being as follows:-

The Dinner and Prizegiving held at Mannings Heath Golf Club went very well in October, sufficiently so for the Association to try to book the same venue for this year - Saturday 22 October - yet to be confirmed by them. The venue was excellent (if a little off the beaten track) and the food was generally thought to be good.

Although, having turned off the A281, it seemed as though the T junction at the end of the road was never going to be seen, everyone arrived safely and found their way home again.

At the last minute, one of Balcombe's guests, Major Greenwood, kindly agreed to present the trophies and medals to the winners and we were all very grateful for his assistance on the night.

Hon Sec's thanks to those who took away medals on behalf of shooters not present - only one case this year of the medals not being handed over for some little time afterwards!

Please think about getting a group of your club members together to attend this year's dinner; you don't have to be a winner to attend - we just all enjoy each other's company and have a good night out.

At last October's dinner, three special awards were made as follows:-

John Williams (now of Ringmer but formerly of Seaford) was awarded a pair of the County's engraved whisky glasses as a small token of appreciation of his 40 years or so service on the County Committee, latterly, of course, as Seaford/Lewes Area Rep.

Bill Stockton (Burgess Hill and Eastbourne) was awarded a County Silver Medal to put right 'a little wrong' in that he should perhaps have been awarded this some 15 or so years ago.

Ken Ballard (Burgess Hill) was awarded an NSRA Long Service Medal, having initially been elected as Club Secretary in 1970, serving until 1977, and being elected as Secretary again in 1982, standing down at the end of 2004. Ken was previously an officer of Croydon Club for very many years and has effectively, therefore, spent a lifetime serving his fellow shooters in various capacities.

Summer Rifle 50m and 100y leagues. These leagues continue to succeed and grow in size, which has in turn led to one or two problems in connection with the distribution of results.

Although many of the markers involved enjoy marking the targets and have done so for many years, the decision has had to be taken to bring all the marking into one area, namely Horsham.

As you know, Trevor Drew, our Stats Officer, collates and distributes the results, but with some markers going away during the summer months (be it work or holidays), this has led to the late issue of results and many complaints from shooters. Trevor is, therefore, this year arranging

for all the targets to be marked closer to home to see if this expedites the issue of results.

Needless to say, both he and Hon Sec are extremely grateful to all those who have been involved in marking the two leagues in the past and your efforts on our behalf have been very much appreciated.

Speaking of leagues, but this time short-range rifle leagues, please note that NSRA 10BM/89 targets must be used, be they 15, 20, 25 yards or 25 metres. An enquiry was made recently as to whether one of our clubs could use similar cards obtained locally but the County rules do state that NSRA cards should be used.

The County continues to up-date its Handbook and it is hoped to distribute an up to date version to all affiliated clubs later this year. It might be that a draft version will be sent out for comment first, before a final copy is confirmed.

County Silver Medal - As you will be aware from a Sighter distributed a year or so ago, Sussex has awarded County Silver medals since 1914. The medal awarded for rifle is based on performance in the County Cup Competition, whilst that for pistol has been based on the best average achieved in the Inter County 20 Yard League. As, for some years now, numbers taking part in 20 yard pistol shooting have declined, it has been decided that the County Silver Medal for pistol will now be awarded to the shooter achieving the highest average in the Inter County 10m Pistol League. As before, in both rifle and pistol, should the 'winner' already hold a medal, they will receive a silver date bar to add to their medal.

A Range Conducting Officer Course was run at East Grinstead on 12 January, instigated initially by the Eastbourne & District League for those in the eastern half of the County. However, one or two other clubs joined in and in all there were around 40 people in attendance, some taking the course for the first time and others on a refresher basis.

The course was `run' by David Parish and our thanks both to him and to East Grinstead for the free use of their range for the event.

Everyone enjoyed the evening and the various questions/discussions which took place gave everyone a thorough insight into the duties of a range officer and how their own clubs could perhaps improve on safety and other matters.

## Petworth Rifle Club

Petworth Club, a very long established club, had its official re-opening on 29 October 2004, following extensive building work, and can now look forward to a secure future, thanks to a grant from the Council Leisure Fund.

Our club has, in recent years, had a change in fortune. Five years ago, we faced possible closure - now, thanks to active measures including a very successful recruitment drive, we are flourishing, with a membership increased from about 12 (average age 65+) to nearly 40 (average age about 40)! I hope to detail how this was achieved in another article in due course.

Our club/range building, which is very old and built of brick and stone, had got into a very dilapidated condition. Inspection by myself, confirmed by the Clerk of Works for our landlords, Leconfield Estate, revealed that very extensive repairs were required if the building was not to deteriorate beyond repair. Because of the precarious state of the club in the 1980s and 1990s, nothing much had been done to the building since a 'bodged' repair of the roof in 1977.

Thanks to a grant of approximately £25,000 from the local council Leisure Fund and approximately £7,000 of work carried out free of charge by the Leconfield Estate, we now have a new insulated roof, complete re-wiring to modern standards, structural repairs and proper heating. The club has also improved the clubroom with redecoration and new furniture, insulation of the clubroom, a de-humidifier to make the room comfortable and general tidying and improvement of the firing point area. We are also fortunate to have received a further grant of £2,000 which, aided by our own funds, has enabled us to bring our club equipment into the 21st Century and purchase a new safe to store it in.

Our re-opening was attended by representatives from the grant provider, Chichester District Council, officials from our landlord, Leconfield Estate, our contractors, G T Stemp & Son, and guests from various other clubs and associations. Several of our invited guests were unfortunately unable to attend on the day because a local trunk road was totally blocked for several hours by an accident.

We would be pleased to welcome anyone who would like to see what has been achieved. FAC holders are welcome to shoot, but please telephone first. The number is 01798 344076.

## 2004 Olympic Games

The following is a first hand account of some unusual events at the Olympic Games held in Athens 2004.

### **A Gold Medal winner at 18**

A noteworthy result amongst many was the result of the 10m Air Pistol Women. In the Final, the scores from the Qualifications were not widespread and the very experienced shooter Jasna Sekaric of Serbia and Montenegro had the highest score of 387, whilst the lowest score in the Final for eighth place was 384 by Olena Kostevych of the Ukraine. This most attractive young shooter of only 18 is also the current World Champion.

Sekaric started with a good shot of 10.3 but then shot poorly and went into eighth place until she recovered to once again regain the lead. Kostevych meanwhile had shot well to rise from eighth place until, on the tenth shot, she was tying with Sekaric. The Ukranian girl had been taking two attempts on each shot and when the tenth shot resulted in a tie, a shoot-off was necessary.

Interestingly, Kostevych did not take two attempts to shoot the tie shot, but released it on the first attempt, which made some wonder if it would be good. It was indeed, and she shot a 10.2 against Sekaric with a 9.4, thus achieving the Gold Medal. Not often is there such a variation in placings in a Final.

### **A very unusual last day of the shooting**

The last shooting competition to be shot during these Games was the 50m Rifle 3 Positions Men. The conditions for the Qualification round were not the easiest seen on this very elaborate range complex, but they were generally manageable and, although no records were established, the scores were still high under the conditions.

The leading shooter in the Qualification was Zhanbo Jia of China with a score of 1171, closely followed by 23 years old Matthew Emmons of the USA with 1169. Whilst looking at some of the slower shooters finishing their kneeling positions and considering what would make the Final, I noticed Michael Anti of the USA fire his last shot kneeling, or so I thought. It appeared after that shot that his score of 1167 would be good enough for the Final but, to my surprise, he made to fire another shot, despite the monitor indicating STOP. He fired this extra 41st shot to the dismay of the USA Coach who was standing beside me and, when he saw what he had done, to the dismay of the shooter also. The illegal 41st shot showed on the overhead display and was confirmed by one of the Sius Ascore technicians who came onto the range to confirm this for the second time that day. Even so, the score, including the two point penalty incurred, of 1165 was still good enough for a place in the Final.

The Final was a most interesting and unusual one. The Chinese Zhanbo Jia shot steadily for the first few shots but then had a rather poor period and Matthew Emmons, who had shot well throughout, was, after the ninth shot, five points in the lead. A Greek commentator mentioned this and said that, with only one shot to go, he was sure to win the Gold Medal. Most of the shooters realised that the Chinese shooter had shot rather poorly and, with the scores announced after each shot, realised that perhaps they had a chance for a medal and with the last shot most of them came off the firing line to see the result.

However, no score had been indicated for Matthew Emmons for his tenth and last shot. He stood there with his hand raised. As Chairman of the Rifle Jury, I went across to see what may be the problem; perhaps the target had malfunctioned, which is a rather rare occurrence and, if so, the Sius Ascore personnel would most likely be aware. However, the answer they gave was a different one. Matthew Emmons, on his last shot, had fired on target number three, whereas he occupied the second firing point. I went over to him to give him the bad news. His only comment in a quiet voice was 'Well, I'll be damned'. From being in the lead, he ended up in eighth place and the Chinese, after all, gained the Gold Medal, as a cross shot scores zero under ISSF rules.

He later explained that before the last shot he was a little nervous and settled down releasing the shot without his normal procedure of checking the target number before each shot. He said that he had not shot on the wrong target since long ago when he was a Junior.

Michael Anti meanwhile had shot steadily and was placed second for the Silver Medal with a score only 1.4 points behind the winner. What would have happened one wonders if he had not shot the 41st and extra shot kneeling? He did not say, but for that extra shot he would have won the Gold Medal. His comment was that he would not have known whether he would have shot better or worse in the Final. A very honest and worthy comment.

One interesting and unpleasant piece of information was given in that someone in the USA had deliberately damaged the chamber of Matthew Emmons' rifle and the rifle he had used to win the Gold Medal in the prone event, and with which he shot the 3 x 40, was borrowed. I am not aware that the culprit has yet been found. With the money received for his Gold Medal prone he purchased a 1972 red Chevrolet Corvette. If he had won both 50m events, he would have been the first to do so in one Olympic Games.

A very good sportsman and surely the best rifle shooter in the world. He will be back and, to show this, he won the 3 x 40 in the World Cup Final in Bangkok with a lead of 8.1 points.

The American rifle team, after a long period with little Olympic success, is now once again back in the forefront of international shooting - and, yes, by the way, I do have what the French would have called 'the unhappy last cartridge', or at least the case!
